3 Statistical Analysis: R (via RStudio)

We use R for statistical analysis; RStudio is an *integrated development environment* (IDE) through which we'll use R. See bit.ly/3PfWbp7 for details. `{swirl}` is an add-on package to R that is designed to teach you R itself.
